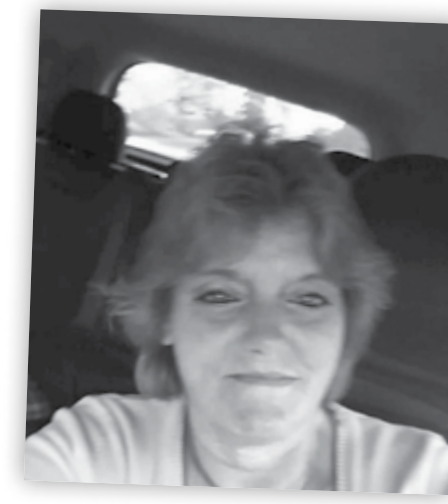

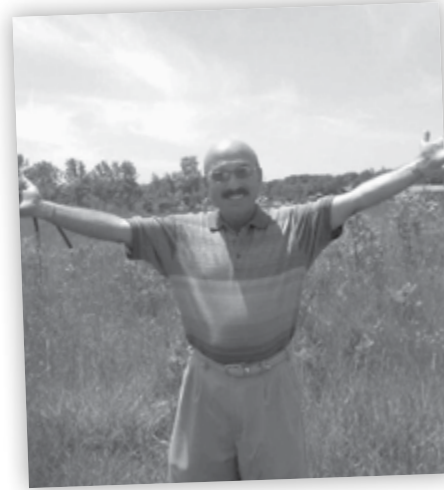


Bob Dendy

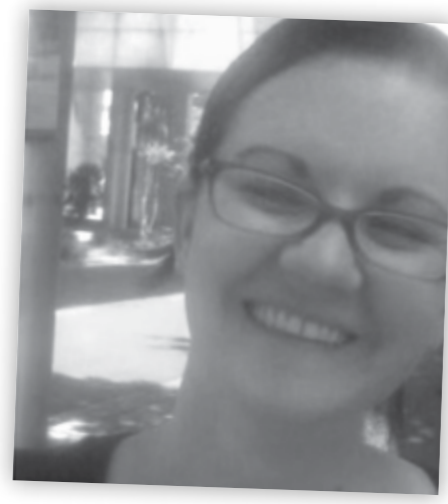
